M.E.G.H.P.,

The Proceedings of the 2023 Semi-Annual Grand Convocation have been available on the Grand Chapter website since May 2023. As the 2023 Semi-Annual Proceeding has been available for inspection and review and will continue to be so, I move that they be accepted as posted, subject to further correction should any cause be found.

4. Report of the Grand Secretary

MEGHP,

I want to thank all the Chapter Secretaries for their dedication and support to their Chapter over the last year. Congratulations to the 2022-2023 Grand Officers for their devotion to Maryland Royal Arch this past term.

Annual Reports: A summary of the Annual Reports for 2023 has been submitted and is on the back of the agenda. All Chapter submitted their report by the deadline, and all fees have been paid. After the Session, I will submit a final report for Maryland to the General Grand Chapter in November.

The Dues cards have been printed for all the chapters and are at the desk for the secretary or representative to pick up after this meeting. I have included a printout of the Chapter membership that I have on the database. I know my list and the number of chapters are not the same. I need each secretary to review my list and compare it to yours. Please report any discrepancies so we can make sure both lists match. This will be extremely important if we merge into a membership management system.

The Membership loss is a concern with this year's report. We had another membership loss of 75 this last year. This includes deaths, demits, and suspensions. Only 21 exaltations were reported this year. Eight of fourteen chapters report exalting at least one member. Of those, only three chapters reported 4-5 members. I know the membership committee will have more on this in their report.

All donations from our Chapters to Royal Arch Research Assistance have been mailed to the General Grand Chapter Coordinator.

Lifetime Achievement: At the semi-annual meeting held in May, the Grand Chapter voted to provide funds to design and purchase a new Lifetime Achievement recognition for current and future recipients. The was accomplished (under budget), and the new Breast Star Badge will be presented to all current serving holders this weekend.

Membership Management System: Over the last few years, discussion has been made concerning the investment into a Membership Management System. Currently, the Grand Chapter and the Grand Council use an Access Database set up in the 1990s by then Grand Secretary/Recorder Gene Raz. There are many drawbacks to this system. First, our members have no access to their information and make changes. Two, The Chapter secretaries have no direct access to the data; 3, the Grand Secretary/Recorder has the only access to make adjustments. These adjustments generally occur once a year. A dedicated M.M.S. would go a long way to elevate the concerns listed above and help in many other ways to make the job of the Chapter

secretaries easier and less stressful. We have been looking into systems like the Grandview M.M.S. used by the Grand Lodge of MD. and the Grand Encampment M.M.S. After researching Vern Huebschman, I feel the best option would be the G.E.M.M.S. During the New Business section of the agenda, a motion will be made to allow discussion of the system and approval to proceed with implementing a new membership system.

Secretary and Recorder School: If the MMS is approved and is in place by the beginning of 2024, we will schedule an MMS Training in place of the regular school in February of 2024.

Ritual Books: We have 15 white ritual books left and will need more shortly. At our last meeting, we discussed having the Grand Lecture with a committee, reviewing the book, and making necessary corrections and additions. I'm unsure if this occurred, but this must be a priority this year.

Hayward Chapter: During the Semi-Annual meeting held in May. The Grand Chapter voted to approve the merger of Hayward Chapter #29 with Talbot Chapter #22. During the summer, the merger took place. All accounts, property, and Membership were transferred to Talbot Chapter.

5. Report of the Grand Treasurer

Most Excellent Grand High Priest G. Andrew Martinez

MEGHP,

The report of the Grand Treasurer is that the Grand Chapter is in good financial condition. As you and the companions know, 2023 has been a challenge largely due to geopolitical activities.

Attached is the Treasurers Interim Report for 2023, an item to note is that at the Semi-Annal this body voted to award \$7,000 in scholarships. At the direction of MEHP, a transfer of \$3,000 was made from the Reserve Account to the D Ross VanSant account to fund the scholarships in excess of the expected dividends and interest of \$4,000.

Also attached is the status of the Trustees Reserve Fund as of September 30, 2023. Of particular note is the value from November 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023. Looking at the 'change in value' shows the volatility in the market in decreases and increases in market values (up \$20K and down \$20K). Overall, the fund is up from \$470,038 to \$509,574 a change of 8.41%. not bad when you consider market volatility.

Supplemental Report:

We have seen a continuing trend over the past several decades of decreasing membership and attendance in all bodies of Freemasonry throughout the state of Maryland. Death is a factor, but lack of attendance can also be linked to resignations and suspensions from non-payment of dues. Unfortunately, it could also be directly related to these same masonic bodies being poorly run.

It is one thing to have a useful, well thought-out, and worthwhile planning program, but is it too difficult to implement or too unrealistic to achieve; if they are then these noble initiatives will just gather dust.

We alt carry a membership card in this wonderful Fraternity and thereby have accepted the responsibility of contributing to it. The two concerns of decreasing membership and stagnant

attendance may have little to do with outside influences and therefore they are within our power to do something about them.

Our Grand High Priest has spent untold hours in trying to solidify, consolidate or eliminate York Rite Chapters of this state. His efforts and expectations are reasonable, attainable, and not too grandiose that positive results cannot be achieved.

With this being said, hear too many times from various chapters that we have petitions and no one to do the work. The York Rite takes entirely too long to get their new petitioners through the system. Recently we had the multi-jurisdictional in which over 50 new York Rite Masons throughout the region received their chapter degrees. How many councils were prepared prior to the multi-jurisdictional to perform the Cryptic Degrees? How many had a representative there to greet them as they registered and let them know when they expected to perform those degrees? There may have been several, but I have heard of only two councils ready to perform these degrees.

Of all the new companions created, how many chapters have reached out and let them know of their next meeting. If we just do the basics at the chapter level in promoting the York Rite, getting trestleboards out in a timely fashion, communicate with the councils, perform the degrees in a timely manner, attend blue lodges and ask the worshipful master for a few moments to speak on behalf of the York rite. I did this at Patapsco during the September meeting and got 1 petition that night. It works.

Our Grand High Priest has provided a flyer on the web page with the question "Why be a York Rite Mason" How many of us has made a copy or two of this and even dropped it off in our own blue lodges let alone another blue lodge. How many have placed petitions at their own or another blue lodge?

Everyone just wants to be a Knight Templar. Another misnomer I have heard. Is this because new candidates do not fully grasp the activities of the Chapters and Councils. If it is, then whose fault is this? Don't have the Grand Chapter set your goals, set them yourselves and then follow through. Contact your members and ask the basic question what do we have to do to see you at our meetings. Maybe if the reason is that they have to go out too many nights for the chapter, council and commandery meetings and if that be the case maybe it might be time to consolidate and have chapter and council on one night. I get it that then the topic becomes that I am out too late but investigate the possibility, discuss it with your membership. Long range planning is in reality short range planning.

20. Report of Membership Committee

Our Maryland membership as of this report is on a downward trend for the first time since I've been tracking their statistics. We are down to 962 Companions from 1016 this time last year. We did Exalt 22 new Companions (from 7 Chapters) at the Multi-Jurisdictional earlier this October to go into 2024 with 984 total Companions (though sadly we are now below 1000 Companions and below 10% (.094 to be exact) of the MD Blue Lodge population). We hope to keep the 22 new Companions moving towards further light by keeping them active in our Chapters. We must find new ways to get more Blue Lodge masons into our Chapters and several Chapters have been offering open events to show off the fellowship we experience as Companions. Innovative ideas have ranged from open table chapters, dinner theater nights, and ghost tours. These kinds of different experiences are critical to getting Brothers more interested in coming into our fold as well as keeping current Companions engaged. I will be working with the REGK. REGS, and our PGHPs and any interested Companions on new ideas to regain/maintain our numbers.

21. Reports to be Received and Published requiring no action M.E. Robert Lumbert. P.G.H.P.

The 2023 Northeast Regional Conference was held in Albany on September 8 and 9, the 8th for Chapter and Council, the 9th for Commandery. I only attended on Friday.

I've attended the Conference many times in the past and generally enjoyed it. But this year it was even better. REGGK Chad Burks said that he uses the Northeast Conference as an example to show other Regions what should be happening there. Apparently, there are some Regions where the Conference consists of little more than introducing dignitaries and hearing from each Jurisdiction about what they have been doing. I only wish we could get more participation from Maryland. There were three there from Delaware, but I was the only Marylander. Not in chronological order, there were three educational talks, two talks on the charities, two presentations from the General Grand Bodies, and two sessions on SWOT, which I will explain later.

The first educational talk was by Michael Sabia, from Connecticut, who by his own description is not a lecturer. His talk wasn't that long, but we did have discussion of it afterward. The title of the talk was "The 27 Select Masters (and one more)". He talked about the various characters appearing in the Select Master degree. Gebal is a city south of Tyre. It is now called Biblos, and in Arabic it is Jubal (ring any bells?). The Giblimites were Phoenicians and known as builders. It is probable that the design of King Solomon's Temple was Phoenician in origin. Ahishar was the

sentinel, in charge of people coming in and out of the Temple. (His depiction in the Select Master degree is probably not fair to him.) Adonairam was a collector of tribute, working under David, Solomon, and his successors. Zabud was an intimate of King Solomon (possibly in multiple senses). We usually think of King Solomon as an old man in our degrees, but in fact the Temple building took place near the beginning of his reign, when he was still fairly young. Hiram, King of Tyre, on the other hand, was much older, having been a friend of David. He was basically a mentor to King Solomon. There is more historical evidence of him, and we know where his tomb is. There is a school of thought that says Hiram. King of Tyre, and Hiram Abif were actually the same person. According to this, the two personalities were separated because the Jews did not like the fact that a foreigner was so intimately connected with so important a project as building the Temple. There was a mention of the fact that there were 22 workmen from Gabal and there are 22 letters in the Hebrew alphabet, but I didn't get the significance.

The second educational talk was by Piers Vaughn, and it was called "The Holy Royal Ark". I didn't take a lot of notes. One reason was that the talk was so densely packed that when I stopped to take notes, I sometimes lost track of what he was talking about. Also, I don't think the microphone at the podium was working quite right, because I occasionally missed some words and sentences. So, there are details missing in the description below. Having a written version of the talk would help.

The question which was the starting point of the talk was "Why do we call it the Royal Arch Degree, if there are no arches in it?". In French the word for "arch" and "ark" are the same, being "arc" as in "arc-en-ciel", the French word for rainbow, literally "arch in sky". Much of the talk was a discussion of how God's relation to man evolved over time. This is illustrated by his interaction with four men, Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Zerubbabel. Noah had both his ark and an arch, the rainbow. With him, God was telling him what to do, and Noah was just obeying. With Abraham, He sends down angels and promises that Abraham will father a great nation. I don't remember where the ark comes in here, and there is some connection as well with Melchizedek from the Anointed High Priest degree. With Moses, God reveals His name and interacts with him personally. The ark here is both the Ark of the Covenant and the basket in which Moses was found in the Nile as a baby. I had never heard the basket referred to as an ark, but I guess it is. Then with Zerubbabel the relationship is even closer to equality. A few other points he made: There is some association between the four men and the colors of the veils, which I can't give you. Noah's ark moved, Moses' ark was somewhat movable, and Zerubbabel's ark was fixed. There is a connection between the passwords used in the Royal Arch and three of the four men.

Some other things were mentioned. The entrance to the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem was made smaller as a wartime precaution sometime in the past, so you are told to "Stoop low" when entering. The journey back to Jerusalem goes through the Syriac and the Chaldean Empires. (I don't know if this is true for Maryland ritual, as New York ritual takes the journey through other

cities.) In Hebrew the numbers (1-9, 10-19, 100-400) are represented by Hebrew letters. You can add up the numbers corresponding to the letters in a word, and two words with the same sum are supposed to be related. I missed how this fit in, but it somehow explains why the number 40 appears so often in the Bible.

The third talk was by Oscar Alleyne from New York, on "The Lion and the Eagle". I have heard him speak before, and this was not one of his best. He started by talking about the Freemasons Arms, which were first described by Dermott-Ahiman Rezon in 1756, based on a design from Rabbi Jehudah Leon (1603-1677). If you think of the Arms of the Grand Lodge of Maryland, you have a good idea of what it looked like. The Rabbi also did "Portrait of Solomon's Temple" (1642) and made wooden models of the same. From here Oscar discussed the symbolism of the lion and eagle in various cultures, including the dream of Cyrus which is mentioned in Knight Masons ritual. It soon got too abstract for me. The talk was also much shorter than scheduled.

There were the two (requisite) talks on the charities, which were worth hearing this year. The RARA talk was by Chad Burks, the GGKing. He put the medical definition of CAPD up, which probably none of us fully understood. But the big point he made was that without the RARA support, research on CAPD would probably cease. He also said there was a proposal to study a link between CAPD and PTSD. Gary Wyne, the Masonic head of CMMRF, talked about recent grants they have gotten. Things are going so well that they had to turn down one grant, because they needed the personnel to focus on the latest aortic aneurism work.

Teko Foly and Chad Burks spoke for General Grand Chapter. Chad spoke about the new Grand Lady of York award and the Mark Master package. The latter includes a Mark Master pin, a half shekel and a great booklet explaining the degree in much detail. The packages cost \$10, but my feeling is that it is money well spent. (I brought one to my Chapter meeting, and we are going to buy some for some who are already Companions.) Teko talked more generally about plans for the future. He offered to write a welcoming letter for new Companions. He also mentioned that there were over 400 people at Branson.

Tom Taylor and Mark Irwin represented General Grand Council. Mark talked mainly about GGCouncil awards. He said that the Veteran's Award could be given to a non-Mason. And there is a new "Friend Zabud" award, which Mark didn't have information on. It is apparently for someone active in the four York Rite bodies and the community. Tom spoke mostly on CMMRF and fund raising for it. He said CMMRF had recently received a \$900K estate bequest.

The remainder of our time, about an hour in the morning and in the afternoon, was spent dealing with SWOT. This is a marketing-type analysis tool which we applied to Masonry in general and the York Rite in particular. It was very well received, and I think most of us would have been happy to spend more time on this. We actually ran over 15 minutes in the afternoon.

For the morning, SWOT stood for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. If you were bringing a new product to market, these are the kinds of things you would want to think about before you did so. We talked about how these apply to York Rite, and we filled up a big sheet with particulars for each one. In the afternoon SWOT stood for Scary, Wild, Outrageous, Threatening. So, these were more "out of the box" ideas. A couple I wrote down were to make more use of the York Rite booklets that Grand Encampment is selling for \$1.00 and to "borrow" the material Scottish Rite has produced to promote York Rite. They also said that New Hampshire has (will have?) a Mark Master Lodge, conferring only that degree with no initiation fee.

This was a great exercise. They transcribed all the "idea" sheets and sent out copies. This would be something worth doing in Maryland if we could get it organized. However, it is only a first step, and more needs to be done to turn the words into actions.

The next Northeast Conference is scheduled for September 6-7, 2024. The place was to be determined, but currently it is planned for Albany, despite the fact that the Albany location is getting expensive. There is a chance that by next fall the General Grand Chapter will have set up a mid-Atlantic Region, and we would be able to have our own Conference. But I'm not counting on that for 2024.

It was moved and seconded to accept the report. Passed unanimously.

22. Events Committee Report

This year's MEPGHP Louis Bandell Memorial Low Vale hosted by Phoenix Chapter #7 on September 17 2023 was a fantastic event. Great ritual and fellowship were displayed, as Companions conferred the Mark Master and Past Master degrees there on two worthy Brothers who finished out their Chapter degrees at the Multi-Jurisdictional hosted in Maryland this year by Druid Chapter #28.

The 2023 Multi-Jurisdictional was held on October 14 and was a race-paced day full of excellent fellowship with 52 candidates becoming new Companions. Great degree work by the District of Columbia (Mark Master), Delaware (Past Master), Virginia (Most Excellent Master), and Maryland (Royal Arch). We are back to the regular rotation cycle, so the Multi-Jurisdictional will be held in D.C. in 2024, Virginia in 2025, Delaware in 2026, and then it returns to Maryland in 2027.

As always if you have upcoming events, you want publicized in The Keystone, just let me know.

A Motion to adopt the proposal of Masonic Membership Solutions LLC (hereafter known as MMS), for the management of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council membership database:

Whereas the current York Rite Database was devised by Comp. Eugene D Racz in the 1990's as method to manage the membership of the three York Rite Grand Bodies;

And whereas this database is kept in a program known as Microsoft ACCESS, and that few Companions have a working experience with this database,

And whereas the Grand Encampment caused the Grand Commandery to be removed from active participation in the YR Database with the creation of the GE MMS;

And whereas many Chapters, Councils and even members have lamented that they did not have direct connection to their own data in the YR Database...but had to go through the Grand Secretary and/or the Grand Recorder respectively to know about their own membership data;

And whereas there is now a viable solution to the lack of connection among the three York Rite Grand Bodies, and the lack of direct communication with and for the constituent local bodies of the Grand Chapter and the Grand Council;

And whereas many of the local Secretaries and Recorders are also Recorders in their respective local Commanderies, and have a working knowledge of the MMS for the Knight Templar data.

THEREFORE....

I move that the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Maryland, and the Grand Council of Royal & Select Masters of Maryland do severely and in unity adopt the appended proposals with

supporting projected costs of implementation supplied by Masonic Membership Solutions LLC dated October 19, 2023.

And that the designated point of Contact shall be the Grand Secretary of the Grand Chapter of RAM and Grand Recorder of the Grand Council of R&SM respectively for the time being and that additionally the Grand Recorder of the Grand Commandery may be added as a point of contact if deemed necessary by the Grand Secretary/Grand Recorder.

And that the 2023 – 2024 Grand Chapter and Grand Council has be amended to include the new costs of the data conversions as stated in the MMS proposal under a separate motion.

And that the data conversion be supervised by the Grand Secretary/Grand Recorder with whatever clerical assistance he may deem advisable to employ.

And that among the many benefits of the MMS system, the Grand Secretary/Grand Recorder shall implement additional services of the MMS to produce and distribute the Annual Membership Card also known as Dues Cards for the local constituent bodies.

And that this motion, if adopted, shall be implemented forthwith and without delay to effect the soonest possible conversion and benefit to our membership and local bodies.
